Cultural Competency for Health Services Administration And Public Health

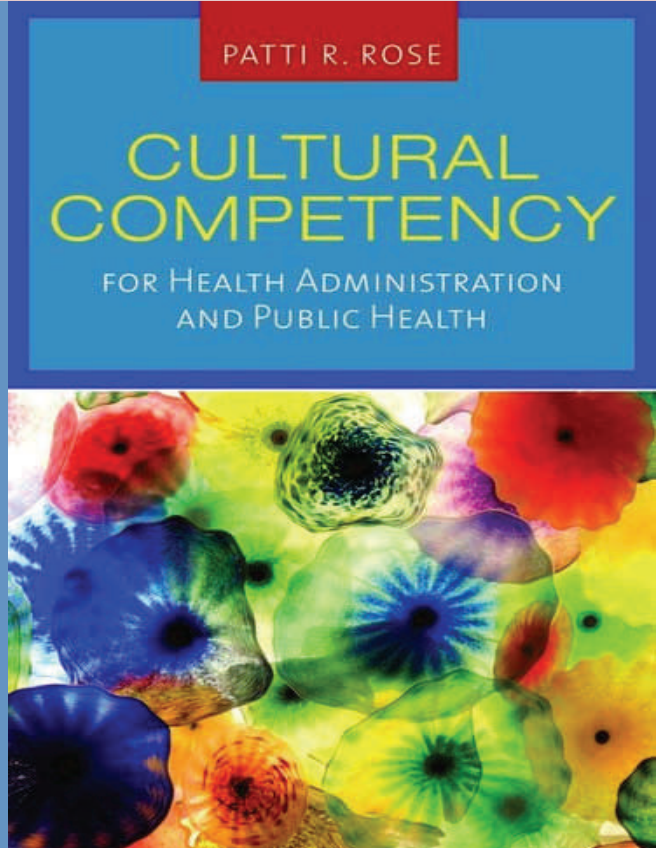
