He has directed the Latin American Studies Program and the Goldfarb Center for Public Affairs & Civic Engagement at Colby. His major books, including *Dubious Link: Civic Engagement and Democratization* (Stanford 2004) and *Argentina, the United States, and the Anti-Communist Crusade in Central America* (Ohio State 1997) focus on important linkages between events and actors drawing from cases in Germany and the US as well as Central and South America. His upcoming book, *Back Door to the Possible: The Social Innovation Boom* provides the first systematic, comprehensive and global discussion of the field of social innovation.
