Under the threat of persecution, Haitian-born Carl -Phillippe Juste and his politically active family were forced to flee their homeland in 1965. Since 1991, he has worked as a photojournalist for The Miami Herald, covering stories around the world. He has received numerous awards for his work, including the Robert F. Kennedy Journalism Award. Juste has traveled to Haiti several times to visually document the earthquake.



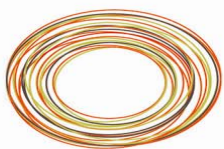
Carl Hersh is a videographer who has covered Latin America and the Caribbean for more than 30 years for ABC, CNN, BBC, etc. documenting conflicts, disasters and upheavals. He recently returned from Haiti where he documented the earthquake and relief efforts.



In their presentation of images on the earthquake Juste and Hersh will discuss the role of photojournalists in documenting this disaster for an industry often bent on sensational entertainment for viewers, shifting from informed citizens to insatiable voyeurs.
