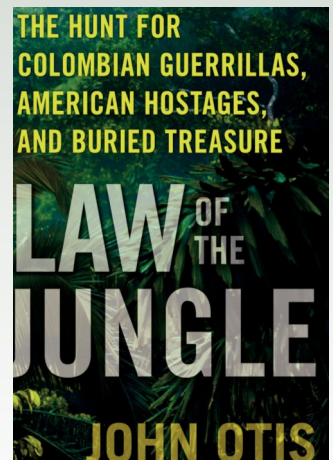

Law of the Jungle is a thrilling true-life adventure tale of American hostages, Marxist guerrillas and buried treasure set in the wilds of Colombia. It's also the true account of how a Saving Private Ryan-style mission degenerated into a frenzied, every-man-for-himself gold rush and the story of one of the most amazing hostage-rescue operations in history.

Born in Minnesota, John Otis has worked as a journalist in Latin America for more than two decades, and also covered the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan. His 2001 investigation of Colombia's FARC guerrillas for the *Houston Chronicle* was honored by the Overseas Press Club as the best reporting out of Latin America. He now reports from Colombia for Time, GlobalPost.com and PRI's "The World" radio program.
