

# Re-visioning Latin American Studies For the 21st Century



**Sonia E. Alvarez** is Leonard J. Horwitz Professor of Latin American Politics and Studies and Director of the Center for Latin American, Caribbean, and Latino Studies at the University of Massachusetts at Amherst. Before arriving at UMass, Alvarez taught Politics, Latin American Studies, and Feminist Studies at the University of California. In Brazil, she has been Fulbright visiting professor at the State University of Campinas, visiting scholar at the Federal University of Santa Catarina, and coordinator of the Rights and Social Justice Program for the Brazil Office of the Ford Foundation. Between 1998 and 2004, she was director and co-principal investigator in the "Hemispheric Dialogues" Program at the UCSC, a project aimed at bridging Latin American and Latina/o Studies. Alvarez also served on the national advisory panel of the Ford Foundation's "Crossing Borders, Rethinking Area Studies" Initiative and is on the editorial advisory boards of several feminist and Latin American Studies journals. From 2004 to 2006, she served as President of the Latin American Studies Association.

She is the author of *Engendering Democracy in Brazil: Women's Movements in Transition Politics* and co-editor of *The Making of Social Movements in Latin America: Identity, Strategy, and Democracy*, and *Cultures of Politics/Politics of Cultures: Re-visioning Latin American Social Movements*.
