

# Democratization of Messianism in Modern Jewish Thought

A former faculty member at the University of Miami (1983-94), Marvin A. Sweeney is currently Professor of Hebrew Bible at the Claremont School of Theology and Professor of Religion at the Claremont Graduate University (1994-present), where he teaches courses in Hebrew Bible studies and the History of Judaism and Jewish Thought. Prof. Sweeney is an expert on ancient Israelite prophetic literature and the interrelationship between politics and religion in the ancient world. He is the author of six volumes, the latest being *Zephaniah* (Hermeneia; Minneapolis: Fortress, 2003). Two more are in press: *The Prophetic Literature (Interpreting Biblical Texts)* (Nashville: Abingdon, summer/fall 2005), and *Form and Intertextuality in Prophetic and Apocalyptic Literature* (Tuebingen: Mohr Siebeck, summer 2005). Prof. Sweeney is currently editing the first volume of the new Cambridge History of Ancient Religions and is a co-editor for the new De Gruyter International Encyclopedia of the Bible. His research projects include a commentary on "Kings," a volume of essays on Jewish Biblical Theology, and a volume on apocalyptic literature. He is also the former editor of *The Review of Biblical Literature* and has written more than 70 articles and ca. 500 reviews in scholarly journals, books, and reference works.
