Professor Amossy (Ph.D. University of Paris VIII – Vincennes), teaches French literature, literary theory, rhetoric and argumentation within the Department of French of Tel Aviv University, of which she has been Chairperson from 1989 to 1992. She is Director of the French Cultural Studies Program at Tel Aviv University School of Cultural Sciences since 2001. She has organized numerous conferences, has lectured at several universities in Europe and North America, and has been a Visiting Professor at the Universities of Paris VIII and Paris III – Sorbonne Nouvelle, Caen, Montpellier, Montreal, and at Laval University. Dr. Amossy has published over 45 book chapters and 50 articles on rhetoric, poetics and semiotics, and has written on Musset, Balzac, Zola, Gracq, Simon, Pinget, and surrealism. She is the author of 6 books, including *Les idées reçues. Sémiologie du stéréotype* (1991), *Dali ou le filon de la paranoïa* (1995), and *L'Argumentation dans le discours* (2006). She has co-authored 4 other books, and edited 12 volumes, including, most recently, *Sociocritique et sciences du langage*. She is *Chevalier des Palmes Académiques* and *Chevalier de l'Ordre du Mérite* of the French Government.
