Alan Goldman received his B.A. from Yale and Ph.D. from Columbia. Before becoming the Kenan Professor at William & Mary in 2002, he taught at the University of Miami for 25 years, 10 as chair of the department. He has held visiting positions at the University of Auckland, University of Michigan, and University of Colorado, as well as an NEH Fellowship in Residence at Princeton. He is the author of *Justice and Reverse Discrimination* (Princeton, 1979), *The Moral Foundations of Professional Ethics* (Rowman & Littlefield, 1980), *Empirical Knowledge* (California, 1988), *Moral Knowledge* (Routledge, 1988), *Aesthetic Value* (Westview, 1995), and *Practical Rules: When We Need Them and When We Don't* (Cambridge, 2002), as well as many articles in epistemology, ethics, aesthetics, and philosophy of law. He is currently working on a book on the nature of practical reason, with the support of ACLS and NEH fellowship grants.
