Colin McGinn is Professor of Philosophy at the University of Miami. His research interests are in the areas of philosophy of mind (particularly consciousness, intentionality and imagination), ethics and philosophical logic. He has published many articles in scholarly journals and is the author of 20 books, including: *The Making of a Philosopher: My Journey through Twentieth Century Philosophy* (Harper Collins 2002), *Consciousness and Its Objects* (Oxford, 2004), *Mindsight: Image, Dream, Meaning* (Harvard, 2004), and *Shakespeare's Philosophy* (Harper 2006).

Mark Rowlands is Professor of Philosophy at the University of Miami. He has written numerous articles in philosophy of mind, psychology, and cognitive science, and also in applied ethics, particularly on the ethical issues pertaining to animals and the environment. His published books include: *The Nature of Consciousness* (Cambridge 2001), *Animals Like Us* (Verso 2002), *Externalism* (Acumen 2003), *The Philosopher at the End of the Universe* (Ebury 2003), *Everything I Know I Learned from TV* (Ebury 2005), and *Body Language* (MIT 2006).
