Haack discusses the scope and purpose of logic, validity, truth-functions, quantification and ontology, names, descriptions, truth, truth-bearers, the set-theoretical and semantic paradoxes, and modality. She also explores the motivations for a whole range of nonclassical systems of logic, including many-valued logics, fuzzy logic, modal and tense logics, and relevance logics. Presupposing only an elementary knowledge of formal logic, this book includes many useful summary tables and diagrams, as well as a helpful glossary of technical terms.

Wide-ranging, informative, and eminently readable, this book has proven a valuable resource for generations of students and scholars in a variety of disciplines. A favorite textbook for advanced undergraduate and graduate courses in philosophy of logic, it is also widely used by logicians and by philosophers who want or need to know about philosophy of logic; by linguists, psychologists, computer scientists, researchers in AI and cognitive science concerned with the relations between natural and formal languages, and between formal logic and informal reasoning; and by engineers and scientists seeking logical tools and needing guidance on the alternatives to classical logic.
