### **BIO INFORMATION**

Mark Mansfield has served as a Visiting Scholar in the Department of Political Science at the University of Miami since the Fall of 2009 and is currently teaching an undergraduate course entitled "CIA and the World of Intelligence."

Mansfield, 52, who joined the Central Intelligence Agency in 1982 and is a career Agency officer, served as CIA's Director of Public Affairs from July 2006 until May 2009.

Prior to that, he had been assigned for a year to the National Counterterrorism Center (NCTC), where he also served as Director of Public Affairs.

Mansfield has held a variety of positions in CIA's Public Affairs Office under nine Directors of the Agency. He served as Deputy Director of Public Affairs from 1997 to 2004 and, prior to that, served as Chief of Media Relations, as a CIA spokesman, and as a speechwriter for the Director. In 1992-93, he supervised an analytical branch in the Directorate of Intelligence.

He began his CIA career as an editor with what was then the Foreign Broadcast Information Service.

Mansfield is a 2005 recipient of the Distinguished Intelligence Medal, the CIA's highest award for service. He received the "Director's Award" from former CIA Directors Mike Hayden and George Tenet.

A native of northern New Jersey, Mansfield now lives in Miami and has a grown daughter.
