

2010 Summer Study Abroad Security, Globalization, and Human Rights in LONDON



May 19 - July 16, 2010

Earn 6 UM Credits with an *internship!*

Travel to London with Fred Frohock, UM Professor and Chair of Political Science, to study security, globalization, and human rights, followed by an **internship at a London-based organization.**

Housing

Students will be housed in London apartments including wireless internet and telephone line rental.

Activities

Students will visit offices of prominent intellectuals, academics, members of parliament, the media, and financial leaders. Students visit the Adam Smith Institute, the U.S. Embassy, Barclays Capital, and the Oxford Union.

POL 308

Security, Globalization, and Human Rights

This course examines politics in Britain as the country copes with recent global problems. The issues to be addressed include the role of the media in security matters, causes and remedies for the global recession, the British government's perspectives on the wars in Afghanistan and Iraq, the moral constraints provided by human rights, the operations of intelligence communities in gathering and using information, and the technological innovations in surveillance in London and their effects on privacy.

POL 520

Internship

Students will be placed in internships with London-based organizations.

Cost: \$8,880 for 6 credits undergraduate tuition and \$5,000 program fee (estimated), which includes housing for 8 weeks in London, entrance fees and tours, several group dinners, and ground transportation. Students must also budget for international airfare, most meals, visa, and personal expenses.
